

Reverse Appliqué with Mini Moons Supply List

Learn a unique technique that makes perfectly smooth small circles with hidden stitching. **Bonus**: An amazing presentation on how the use of contrast and block layout completely change the look of this miniature quilt. **Everything in pink is clickable!**

Materials:

- · Pattern: Mini Moons quilt pattern printed version, PDF download
- · Printable coloring pages, free
- · Fabric (Kits Available): Avoid low thread count fabrics as they fall apart when cut on the bias.
 - o (1) 5" x 5" precut square pack or (20) 5" squares, circles
 - o (2) or more background fabrics, ½ yd of each, starch, press, cut (16) total 6" squares
- · Coordinating thread
- · Batting, backing, and binding are not needed for class but will be needed to finish the quilt, refer to the pattern for requirements.

Supplies:

*Availability of sewing machines, cutting stations, and ironing stations varies by venue — please check event details for what's included.

- · Elmer's School Glue, washable
- · Fineline Glue Tips (for Elmer's), optional
- Precut Heavy-Duty Freezer Paper Templates or Sheets
- · Marking pen or chalk pencil
- Seam Guide Tool for HSTs by Creative Grids, optional
- · Easy Press Pen or Spray Starch

- · Rotary cutter and cutting mat*
- · Sewing machine* with an open toe foot
- · Seam ripper (just in case!)
- Fabric scissors or Snips
- · Paper scissors
- · Small ruler for rotary cutting
- · Iron* and pressing mat*
- Colored pencils

Before class:

- 1. Starch and press background fabrics. Curves require working with bias. Starching fabric before cutting reduces distortion.
- 2. Cut (16) 6" squares from background fabrics.
- 3. Order the Mini Moons quilt pattern or purchase it in class
- 4. Order supplies at SnapdragonQuilting.com or purchase them in class
