



Mastering Curved Piecing with the Many Moons & Broken Moons Quilt Patterns

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Adding curves to a quilt has never been easier. We will cover cutting curves and three different ways to piece curves so that you can try them all and find your favorite way. The smaller size option has the same number of blocks. I recommend making the larger version as it is easier. **Bonus:** We'll explore how color, contrast, and fabrics change the look of these quilts. **Everything in pink is clickable!**

Supplies:

*Sewing machines, and cutting and ironing stations may or may not be supplied by the venue.

- Pattern: [Many Moons](#) or [Broken Moons](#), your choice, also available as [PDF Downloads](#)
- Fabric ([Broken Moons Kits](#) Available): Avoid low thread count fabrics as they fall apart when cut on the bias. Refer to the pattern for yardage.
- [Coordinating thread](#)
- Batting, backing, and binding are not needed for the class but will be needed to finish the quilt, refer to the pattern for yardage.
- [Glue pen](#) or glue stick, washable
- [Pins](#)
- [Rotary cutter](#)
- 8" quilting [ruler](#) (or larger) for rotary cutting*
- Sewing machine with a quarter inch foot or standard foot - the one you prefer for sewing a ¼" seam*
- [Seam ripper](#) (just in case!)
- [Circle Savvy Ruler](#), optional
- [Curve Master Presser Foot](#), optional
- [Flatter](#), optional
- [Iron & Pressing Mat](#)*

Before class:

1. Order a [pattern](#) and [supplies](#) at SnapdragonQuilting.com or purchase in class.
2. [Starch](#) fabric - Curves require working with bias. Starching fabric **before cutting** it is important for reducing distortion.
3. From a background fabric cut (2) 15½" squares (10½" squares for the smaller size quilt). Cut each square in half diagonally to create (4) large triangles total.
4. Bring a 13" x WOF strip or a fat quarter of (2-3) of the moon fabrics to class.
5. Do **not** cut the curves as we will do this in class.
