

Pamela Mae Supply List

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In this workshop, we'll explore two different methods for piecing curves. Tighter curves can feel challenging but I'll show you a technique that makes them both easy and precise. We'll also go over tips and tricks to ensure your larger curves come together smoothly and accurately. **Everything in pink is clickable!**

Supplies:

- ·Pamela Mae Quilt Pattern, available in two formats: Printed Pattern (mailed to you) and PDF Download (instant access)
- · Coloring Pages, free
- · Coordinating Thread
- · Fabric, see pattern for yardage
- · Marking Pen, temporary
- · Glue pen, washable
- · Elmer's School Glue, washable
- · Fineline Glue Tips (for Elmer's Glue)

Before Class:

- 1. Order the Pamela Mae Pattern and supplies at SnapdragonQuilting.com or purchase in class.
- 2. Starch fabric Curves require working with bias. Starching fabric **before cutting** helps reduce distortion.
- 3. Follow the cutting instructions in the pattern to cut out the squares and rectangles. Do not cut out any of the curved pieces as we will do this in class.

- · Heavy Duty Freezer Paper
- · Easy Press Pen or Spray Starch
- Fabric Scissors
- Snips, optional
- Rotary Cutter
- Rotating Mat for rotary cutting*
- · Iron and Ironing Mat*
- Sewing machine with an open toe foot and a ¼" foot*
- *Sewing machines, basic cutting supplies, and ironing stations may or may not be supplied by the venue.
- 4. Follow the directions in the pattern to complete the sections titled:
- · Make Square Blocks
- Make Square Block Halves
- Assemble Top, Center, and Bottom of Quilt Top
- 5. Prepare Templates: Print or copy templates A and B onto freezer paper and cut them out. If using the PDF pattern, print templates C-F, cut out and assemble. If using the printed pattern, cut out templates C-F.
